Frustration as flooding in Derbyshire strikes for third year in a row

Over 26,500 residential properties are potentially at risk from flooding in Derbyshire.*

Approximately 10,100 residential properties are potentially at risk from flooding in Derby.*

Flooding has hit parts of northern England for the third year in a row and hundreds of homes, schools and businesses have taken yet another battering from heavy rainfall. Landmark Information Group, the UK's leading provider of flood data, reports that with over 26,500 homes in Derbyshire and approximately 10,100 homes in Derby itself situated in an area of potential flood risk, homeowners should find out if their property is at risk and take steps to minimise damage.

James Sherwood-Rogers Managing Director for Landmark Legal and Financial comments: *"It is awful that so many people have been hit by floods in homes that they thought would never be affected. Pluvial flooding, or flooding caused by rainfall, isn't considered by many to be a risk, but it is in fact one of the biggest sources of household flooding in the UK.*

"Derbyshire has born the brunt of climate change and yet again many homes and businesses have been affected by flooding. It is clear to see that heavy rainfall is now not a freak occurrence and we should expect to see more to come in the future. Homeowners need to find out if they are at risk so that they can take the appropriate steps to protect their assets.

"We need to learn from the lessons of the 2007 and 2008 floods and make sure that we know the flood risk to our homes and make moves to protect our families and property."

Landmark is working closely with the National Flood Forum (NFF) who also supports the need for comprehensive flood advice for homeowners. Joining forces, Landmark and the NFF are working together to launch the Know Your Flood Risk campaign in an effort to increase the profile of flooding and to ensure consumers are not only aware of the risks they face, but also how to mitigate them.
